As CEO of Venture Communications, her creative and strategic approach has turned the company into a powerhouse with a blue chip client list. She is also the CEO of YouInc.com, a company she founded in 2012 that is dedicated to serving and investing in entrepreneurs and the entrepreneurial lifestyle. Daniel Pink – “Leadership and the New Principles of Influence” – Daniel Pink is the author of five provocative books about the changing world of work, including the long-running New York Times best seller, *A Whole New Mind*, and the #1 New York Times best seller, *Drive*. Currently, Pink hosts *Crowd Control*, a series on National Geographic Television that solves problems using unique design, technology and behavioral science principles. His latest book *To Sell Is Human: The Surprising Truth About Moving Others*, offers a fresh look at the art and science of selling. Pink’s articles on business and technology have appeared in publications, including The New York Times, Harvard Business Review, The Sunday Telegraph, Fast Company and Wired. He has provided analysis of business trends on CNN, CNBC, ABC, NPR, and other networks in the U.S. and abroad.
