Advisory Councils help to support CPHR BC & Yukon in the provision of a variety of professional development opportunities, networking opportunities, and other programs for its members. Events offer peer support, social contact and the opportunities to learn about current human resources issues and legislation.

Advisory Councils typically meet periodically in-person and are active throughout the year via other forms of communication. Council Members act as ambassadors of CPHR BC & Yukon, lead specific tasks and projects pertaining to their skills and interests, and must be current members of the Association.

Members of the Advisory Council are expected to attend a good proportion of events operating in the region. There are several benefits of volunteering for council membership, such as discounts on some events in the region, plus time volunteered contributes to CPD credits. A minimum one-year term is expected starting January 1st 2019, with a maximum term of six years.
