## WESTERN CANADA HR STUDENTS COMPETE at HRC WEST 2024

On March 1 and 2, 2024, CPHR BC & Yukon, along with our partners at CPHR Alberta, brought together teams of students from post-secondary business programs across Western Canada to test classroom learning by merging theory with real-life simulations in a competitive environment in a case competition dedicated entirely to the field of HR. The HRC West two-day event provided post-secondary student teams with a unique opportunity to: access a unique platform for the exchange of ideas with HR students from across Western Canada; test what they have learned in the classroom with a comprehensive business case that explores a pressing HR challenge.

HRC West was first hosted in 2017 and alternates between the two provinces. The 2024 competition was held at Camosun College, situated on the territories of the Lakwanan (Songhees and Kosapsum) and WSÁNEĆ peoples.

Schools competing from BC included Acsenda School of Management, Camosun College, College of New Caledonia, Douglas College, Melville School of Business, Kwantlen Polytechnic University, Okanagan College, Thompson Rivers University - Bob Gaglardi School of Business and Economics and Vancouver Island University.

And from our neighbouring province, Bow Valley College, MacEwan University, Mount Royal University, NorQuest College, Northern Alberta Institute of Technology, Red Deer Polytechnic, SAIT and University of Alberta.

Friday night opened with an impactful address by Songhees Nation Elder Dr. Skip Dick. Students were then mixed up, not knowing who was from where for some networking activities and the draw for the pool of teams.

Early Saturday, four pools of four teams competed in their first round presentations on a case study focused on implementing the recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission in workplaces. After three hours of preparation on a business case they were just setting eyes upon, they were ready to share their findings.

By afternoon Saturday, four teams remained to compete in the final round, once again presenting their ideas and strategies.

It was a tough competition, but the winning teams were determined:
